Grade 5 Up—An unusually varied and useful collection of 44 folktales ranging from legends involving the ethical dilemmas of King Solomon to stories of the Prophet Elijah to wisdom tales of ancient rabbis to universal stories given a Jewish slant and selections from near-modern times. The inspiration for Obermans retellings stems from many cultures and continents, yet his direct, relatively unadorned language manages to convey the time and atmosphere of each setting. Sometimes reverent, sometimes jocular, each of the stories has something to teach. Oberman appends explanatory notes and source information to each folktale. Penninah Schram, who completed the editing after Obermans death, has augmented the commentaries. Scholars will appreciate the notes indicating folkloric motifs and variants as well as the full bibliography. This is a gold mine for storytellers and educators alike.—*Miriam Lang Budin, Chappaqua Public Library, NY*

Gr. 5-8. Told in the relaxed, informal voice of someone totally at home with the material, this collection of 43 traditional Jewish stories is authoritative as well as immensely entertaining. Before his recent death, scholar-storyteller Oberman collected and retold the folktales, providing brief introductions to each along with endnotes about culture and sources. His colleague Penninah Schram has added a fine general introduction and contributed some of the commentary. The stories, from both Ashkenazi and Sephardic traditions, are arranged more or less chronologically--from biblical days through the talmudic period to more contemporary times. There are legends, medieval fables, trickster tales, and more. As Oberman points out, the fun is not in the kick at the end of the stories, but in the telling and the wry sense of recognition. The stories, wonderful for storytelling and sharing, are accessible even to listeners younger than the target audience, and the notes and commentary will provide older children with context and history. For more stories to share with children, look to Isaac Bashevis Singer's *Gimpel the Fool: And Other Stories* (1957).
